
How I Lived in NYC, LA, San Diego, San Francisco, Hawaii, and Miami in a Year



- It is important to be flexible and adaptable when you move to a new city. Things will not always go according to plan.


If you are thinking about moving to a new city, I encourage you to do it. It is an amazing experience that will teach you a lot about yourself and the world.



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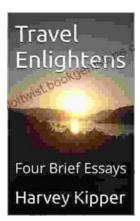
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
