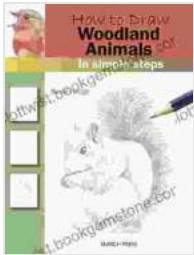

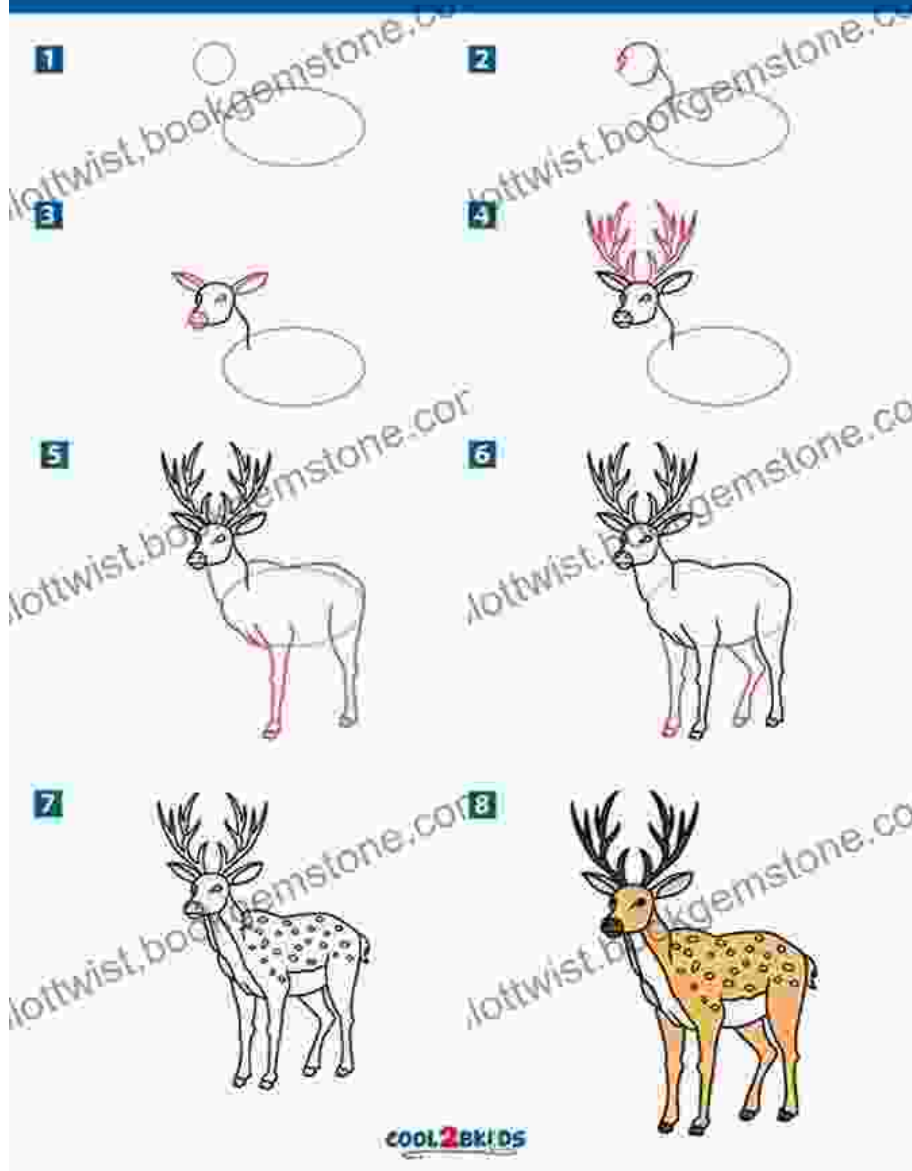

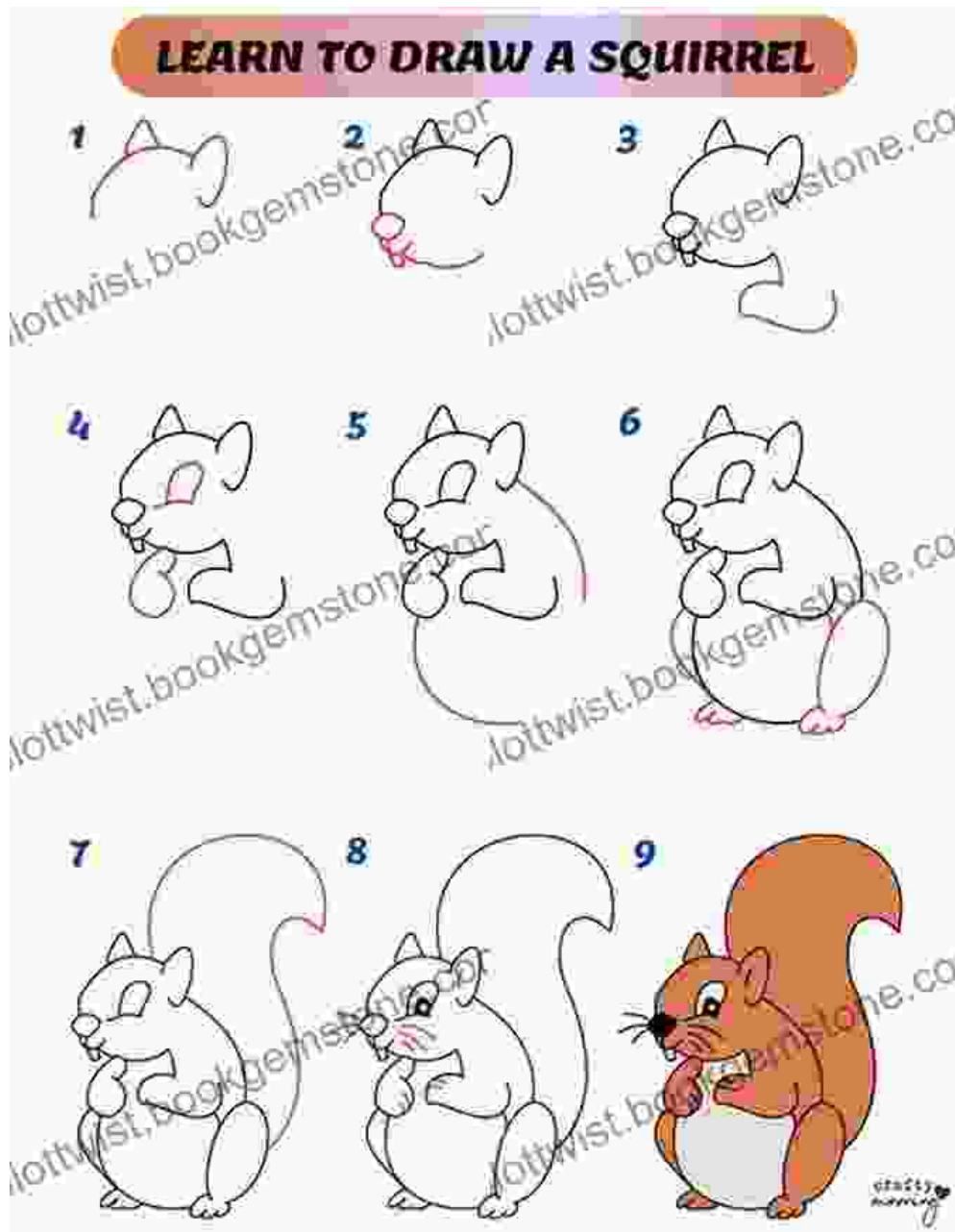
How to Draw a Deer



Squirrel

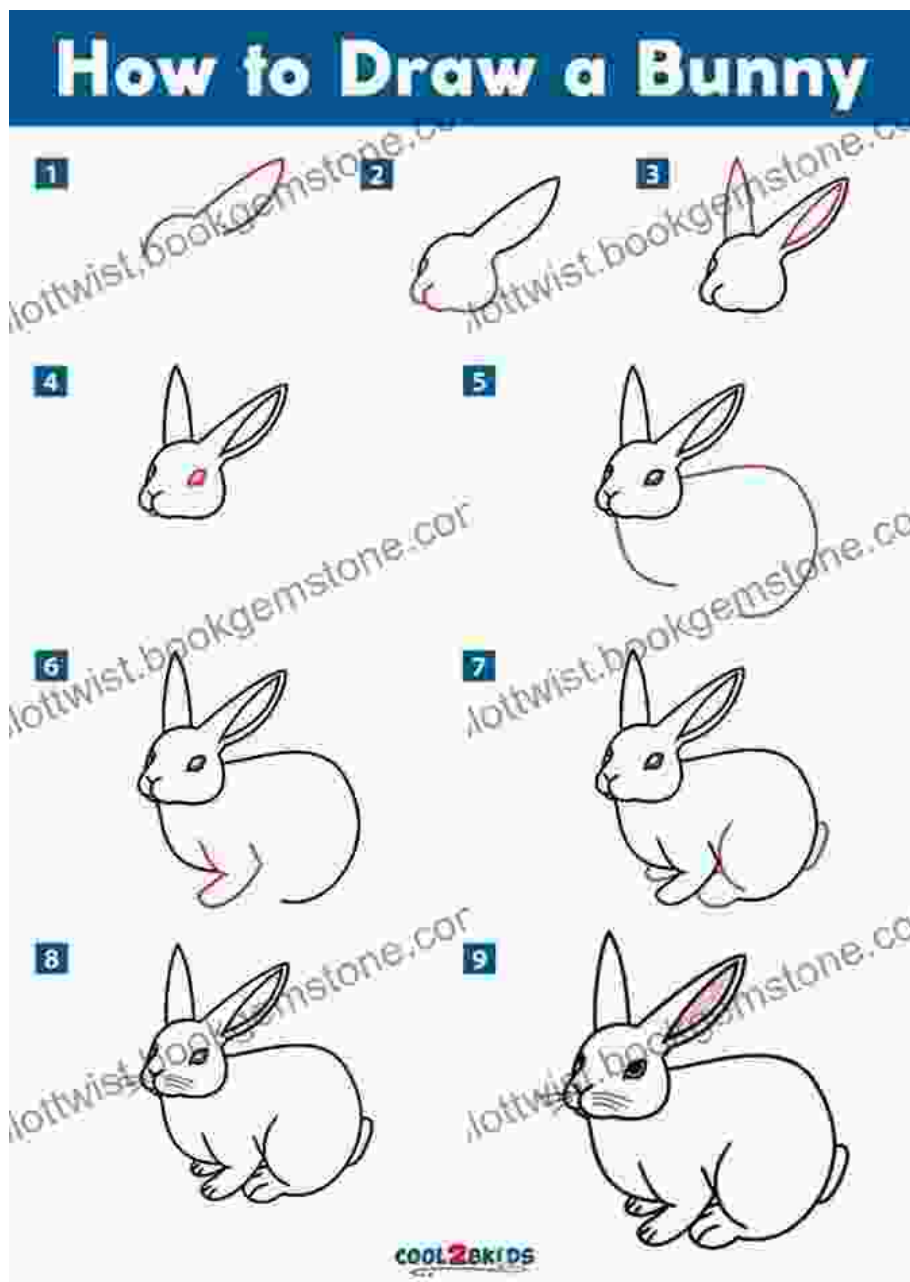
