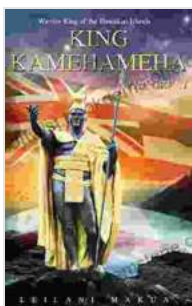


Early Life and Rise to Power

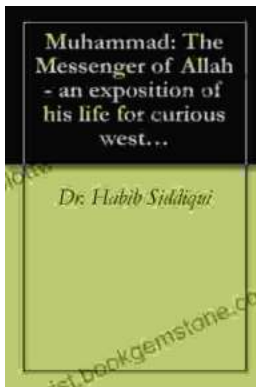

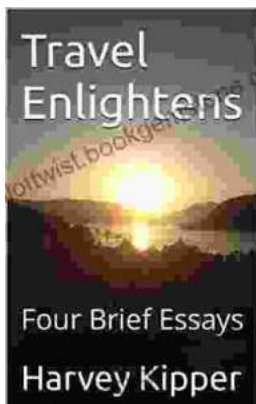
