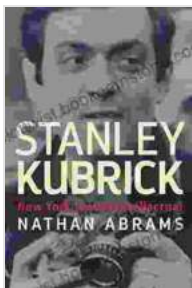


Stanley Kubrick: The Jewish Intellectual Who Changed Cinema

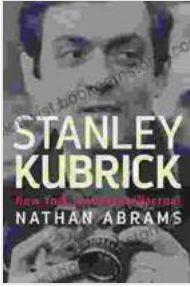

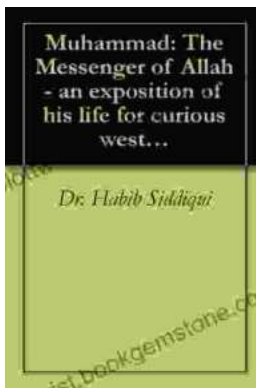

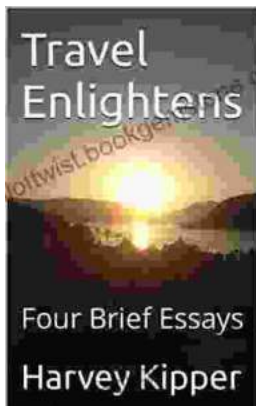
